The Arrighi Center was established in 2012 as an interdisciplinary research center devoted to the study of urgent contemporary problems arising from processes of globalization. It expands upon the work done in the previous 40 years by the Institute for Global Studies in Culture, Power and History and the Program in Atlantic History, Culture, and Society. The Center is named in memory of Giovanni Arrighi (1937-2009), former Director of the Institute for Global Studies and George Armstrong Kelly Professor of Sociology.

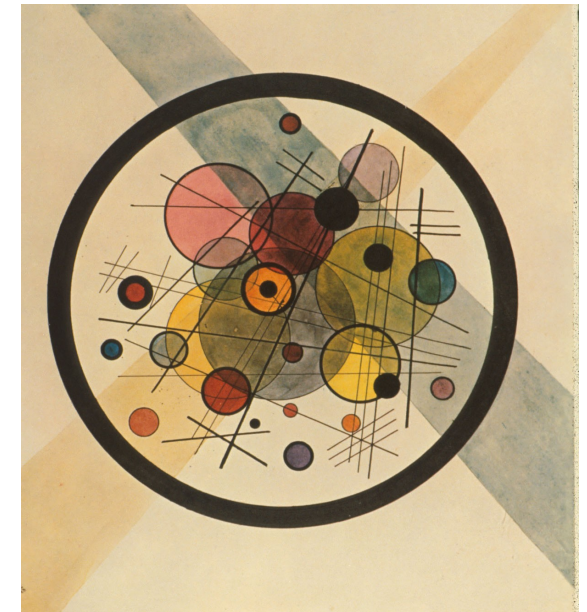

Double Major

International Studies and Sociology (GSCD) Dual Major Requirements

GSCD Research Concentration

- Research Methods (230.202)
- Introduction to Social Statistics (230.205)**
- Research Tools for Global Sociology and Development (230.265)**
- Global Social Change and Development Research Practicum (230.325)

Economics or Economic Sociology

Students must complete four courses (12 credits) in Economics or Economic Sociology, including

- Elements of Macroeconomics (180.101)
- Elements of Microeconomics (180.102)
- Two Additional Courses

History or Historical Sociology

GSCD students must complete **five** semester courses (15 credits) in History or Historical Sociology.

Two out of the five courses must be listed with the History Department

Foreign Language

Proficiency in at least one foreign language. Proficiency may be demonstrated by completing two semesters of coursework beyond the intermediate level.

Gateway

Choose one of the following gateway courses

- AS.230.101 Introduction Sociology
- AS.190.111 Introduction to Global Studies
- AS.230.150 Issues in International Development

Political Science or Political Sociology

In addition to the gateway course, GSCD students must complete five semester courses (15 credits) in Political Science or Political Sociology.

- One International Politics (IR) or Global Sociology Course
- Two Comparative Politics (CP) or Comparative Sociology Courses
- One American Politics (AP) or Sociology of the United States Course
- Social Theory (230.213) (Fulfills Political Theory Requirement)

Additional Considerations

A total of eleven courses must be taken in the Sociology Department (AS.230).

Declare both International Studies and Sociology
**230.205 and 230.265 count as Q courses for distribution requirements



What is GSCD?

Global Social Change and Development (GSCD) is a **rigorous, research-oriented** program that will help students understand the dramatic and rapid transformations associated with contemporary processes of globalization. GSCD will provide students with a sophisticated set of technical, research, and critical-thinking skills while preparing students for success in twenty-first century professions and helping them become thoughtful global citizens.

Students who complete the GSCD requirements will graduate with **majors in both International Studies and Sociology**. This allows students to pursue a focused course of study, with a strong grounding in international sociology, theory, statistics, and comparative-historical methods. Students also benefit from the **interdisciplinary education** provided by the International Studies major, which draws on the strengths of the Johns Hopkins University faculty in fields such as Political Science, History, Economics, and Anthropology.

Students who successfully complete a set of prerequisites will have the opportunity to **participate in professional research groups** with faculty and graduate students in the Arrighi Center for Global Studies.
