This course is the continuation of the Beginning Hindi 1 course offered last semester. We will cover chapters 18 to 26. Students will master the present, present continuation, future, and past tenses. In addition, they will master the usage of modes such as 'होना, पड़ना, चाहिए' etc.. Students will be able to converse in simple Hindi and will be able to understand basic everyday used vocabulary.
