The process of iron making from start to finish.


An interactive smell box and sound box will be used in recreating the Catoctin Furnace working environment.

The negative environmental and worker health impacts conclude the exhibit's examination of daily life at the furnace.






Isabella Furnace and its attached casting shed will be the future home of this exhibit.
