The Neuroscience & Behavioral Biology programs will conduct a series of **workshops** for our students. This is an opportunity to network with your peers and gain information about your specific major.

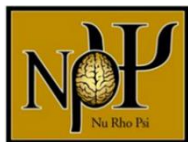

- Resume or curriculum vitae
- Statement of intent
- Official transcript(s)
- Two letters of recommendation

### Program Eligibility

Bridge scholars must have:

- A four-year degree from an accredited college or university
- A minimum GPA of 2.7 on a 4.0 scale
- A desire to apply to Ph.D. programs after completing the Bridge Program
- U.S. citizenship or permanent residence status
