About our grants



HUMANITIES

- Louis E. Goodman Award: \$1,000 to facilitate personal enrichment in a discipline (arts and humanities) that may not otherwise be pursued by the recipient.
- Humanities Research Clusters: For open discussion of current topics in evolving and understudied interdisciplinary fields. Up to \$1,000 for meetings, materials, and guest speakers.



NATURAL SCIENCES

- **John Camp and Mindy Farber '74 Endowed Award**: Approximately \$4,000 for research in brain sciences, especially brain cancers.
- Jeffrey Ma Shiu and Emily Liu Endowed ASPIRE Award: \$4,000 for research in brain sciences.
- Albstein Research Scholarship: Up to \$5,000 for research in brain sciences, especially Alzheimer's research.



INTERNATIONAL RESEARCH

- Phares Family Grant for International Engagement: \$7,000 award for international research, with preference given to students unable to study abroad during the academic year.
- Meg Walsh Award: Provides a graduating senior with \$32,000 to undertake an independent project abroad in the year after they graduate.



ANY SUBJECT AREA

- Dean's ASPIRE Grants: Up to \$5,000 for independent projects in any subject.
- Bander Family Fund Award: Up to \$4,000 for creative summer projects.
- Woodrow Wilson Fellowship: Up to \$10,000 for a three-year independent project. Available to first-year students only. See our website and separate flyer for details.

APPLICATION PROCESS



September/October:

- Attend info session (Sept 21 or 22)
- Attend proposal workshop (Oct 12 or 13)
- Talk to potential faculty mentors

October 27:

- Submit pre-application
 Apply feedback and
 - Draft abstract
 - Draft proposal
 - Draft budget
 - List of potential mentors

November:

- Apply feedback and revise materials
- Identify faculty mentor
- Secure letter of recommendation

November 27:

- Submit final application
 - Abstract
 - Proposal
 - Budget
 - o CV
 - Transcript
 - Letter of recommendation
