Study Treks, Practicums, and Career Treks

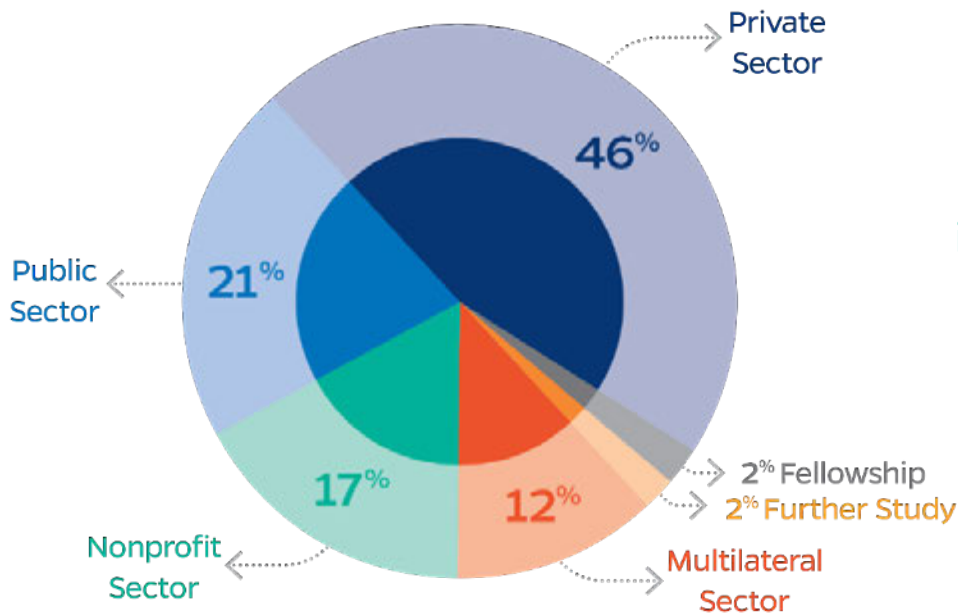
We have more than **50** study treks, practicums, and career treks organized by the academic programs and global career staff each year

The BA/MA Program

- Only 8 candidates selected to attend SAIS
- Expectation to complete program in 5 consecutive years
- Candidates chosen for program during sophomore year at Hopkins
- Spend junior year taking relevant Hopkins courses and completing undergraduate requirements
- Receive BA after first year of graduate degree and MA after the second year at SAIS; students attend graduation ceremony for their BA after year four, except at the Hopkins-Nanjing Center
- Participate in the same rigorous academic program; study with the same professors, interact on the same basis as everyone else with student body; fulfill same graduation requirements.

Junior Year Abroad Program

- Up to 6 candidates selected to attend SAIS Europe campus in Bologna, Italy during junior year
- Apply in sophomore year
- After one year in Bologna, come back to Homewood for senior year
- Not guaranteed admission to SAIS in the future
- If admitted, candidates receive a semester's advanced standing for year spent in Bologna.
- Exempted from taking any required courses completed during the year abroad
