<p>COVID VERSUS INFLUENZA</p>	<p>The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention believes it’s likely that both flu and COVID-19 viruses will be spreading this season. Because some of the symptoms of flu, COVID-19, and other respiratory illnesses are similar, a diagnosis about one versus the other cannot be made based on symptoms alone. Testing is needed to confirm a diagnosis. Furthermore, people can be infected with both the virus that causes flu and the virus that causes COVID-19 at the same time and have symptoms of both influenza and COVID-19.</p> <p>We ask you to monitor yourself for any symptoms (runny nose, sore throat, cough, fever), and if you are not feeling well, stay home from JHU campuses. We are also asking faculty to excuse students from in-person instruction and provide alternate means for students and trainees to participate in instructional activities when that is possible. We want our students to feel they are able to stay away from classes if they are sick, avoid spreading germs, and take care of their health without fearing academic repercussions. 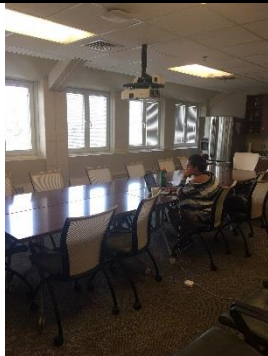
